# SCHOOL MESSAGE

We are now a few weeks into term and the pupils are beginning to hit their stride and show off some of their new and improving knowledge across the curriculum. Mrs Quinn enjoyed visiting classes on Monday afternoon to see how the children were enjoying their learning, and she was really pleased to hear children share the facts and skills they have developed, from their knowledge of Ancient Greece and Iraq, to growing confidence in PE. We are really proud of the hard work our children are putting into their learning and we hope to see this continue to grow through the year.

As a school, we also work hard to provide support for children and families who may need a little extra at times, and we want families to continue to be open to working with us when their child or family may need a little help.

If you feel your child may be struggling in class with their learning, friendships or is anxious about something in school, then the first port of call is always their class teacher, who is available most days on the playground at the end of the day. They can also be contacted via the school office.

If your concern relates to a possible medical, mental health or additional learning need, such as dyslexia, ADHD or Autism, then Mr Birkinshaw is contactable every day. As our Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator (SENCo), Mr Birkinshaw works with families and pupils to discuss strategies to support any diagnosed or emerging needs, and also works with other professionals who may be able to provide support for your child. Mr Birkinshaw is contactable in school most days on the playground, via the office or by emailing senco@tunstead.norfolk.sch.uk.

We recognise that asking for help in a time of need can be a really hard step, but our team is always here to listen and help in whichever way we can for your child and family. Should you ever feel that you need additional help as a family, maybe with finances, school uniform, food, a bereavement or in managing behaviours or emotions at home, then we are also here to help. Mrs Ratcliffe, our Inclusion Worker, has experience working with children or families dealing with challenges in or of school, as are Mrs Quinn and Mr Birkinshaw.
