### SCHOOL MESSAGE

#### Dear parents and carers

A month has now somehow flown by since term began, and as the colder weather approaches so too do the coughs and colds of autumn time. As we do every year, we have had a few bugs and Covid cases within the school and we advise families to make sure their children are off school in line with national advice to ensure they have time to recover and also to ensure everyone in the school community stays fit and well. If your child has diarrhoea/vomiting, they must stay home until 48 hours have passed from the last incident of their condition; for any Covid cases, they should be off school for the first 3 days since testing positive or since symptoms started. If you are ever not sure, please contact the school office and we can share the advice we have.

The rest of today's newsletter is focused on sporting activities going on across the school, as we have now reached the point of year where our pupils start taking part in a range of matches and competitions.

Yesterday saw our first whole school sporting event of the year, the Tunstead Challenge, take part on the village field behind the school. It was really nice to see families from across the school come down to watch the cross country runs for each class, and I would like to thank all those who attended to cheer all our pupils on.

The children themselves were a good mix of enthusiasm and resilience, whether they were completing their first school race in Oak Class or a Birch class pupil completing the last of their 3 laps. It was particularly lovely to hear the children cheering on the runners as they came past, which really showed the community spirit between our pupils. Those who finished in the top 8 for Conifer and Birch classes will now go onto the cluster cross country competition in November, and more details on this will come out in the coming weeks.

Next week sees a first outing for the school football team this year, as they travel for the 'Green Shoots Derby' against St Johns on Monday afternoon. Our team this year includes a mix of boys and girls from across Conifer and Birch classes, and their enthusiasm and growing skill levels should mean we have a team that can build up in confidence and gel as a squad over the coming years.
