SCHOOL MESSAGE

And just like that, we have now reached the mid-point of the school year! There have been some really memorable moments in school already this year, including the Valentine's disco last night, and we are all looking forward to more events and activities coming up in the second half of the year. The first of these is World Book Day on Thursday 7th March. We have a few various activities planned around this, information of which was put in an email which you should have received earlier this week.

One focus we will have from after half term is around healthy snacks, drinks and lunch boxes. Over recent weeks, it has been noticeable that some pupils are being provided with unsuitable drinks or food for their school day. We are asking that all pupils be provided with appropriate snacks as detailed in our school policies and prospectus, which are copied below and can also be found on our website.

Drinks: Please provide your child with a plastic sports, 'stopper type' bottle. The bottle should be clearly named and it can be taken home to be washed and refilled at the end of each day. Please note bottles should be filled with water only.

In exceptional circumstances, where pupils have an identified medical or additional need that has been discussed with school, individual pupils may have an alternate drink. If you feel your child requires this, please contact Mr Birkinshaw.

Snack: Children in Key Stage 1 will have fruit daily as part of the 'fruit for schools' campaign. Children in Key Stage 2 may also bring a piece of fresh fruit/cereal bar or dried fruit from home to eat at snack time. Children are not permitted to bring sweets for snack time.

Packed lunches: Packed lunches should not contain sweets or fizzy drinks. We operate a nut free policy. Please ensure that the snacks and packed lunches that you provide for your children do not contain nuts.

Should any child come into school with an unsuitable snack or drink, these will be set aside/left in their bag until home time and a suitable alternate offered where possible. If it is not possible, parents or carers will be contacted to provide an alternate as soon as possible.
