SCHOOL MESSAGE

Over the coming weeks, many of our pupils will be taking part in various forms of assessment that you may hear about at home. While these are a mandatory part of the school system at this time, the team in school work carefully with the pupils to try and make sure the children are as comfortable and relaxed as possible for them. We also recognise that their personal strengths as sportspeople, artists, writers, coders and well-rounded young people are far more important than the results of a test.

Next week in school will see our Year 6s take on the challenge of SATS, and we are all so proud of their hard work this year and their determination to show what they can do. While SATS remain a necessary part of school life for Year 6, they are not how we will judge their time with us.

Our Year 2 pupils will also be completing SATS assessments, which take place in a more informal manner than the Year 6 tests and will happen in stages over the rest of the term. These are approached more like tasks to do within a lesson, and are completed to support the end of year teacher judgements. These assessments are no longer mandatory nationally, but we have chosen to keep them to inform our future planning to support our children in the best ways possible.

After half term, we have two other year groups taking part in shorter, more specific national assessments. Year 1s will be taking part in the national phonics check, and our Year 4s take on the Multiplication Times Tables Check.

Should any parents have any questions about upcoming assessments for their child, then please ask your child's class teacher or Mr Birkinshaw.
