We invite you to encourage your child to take up the <u>Summer Reading Challenge</u>. It's the UK's biggest reading for pleasure programme for children aged 4 to 11, delivered via public libraries. Children can sign up for free at their local library or <u>online</u> – please see below for further details.

The Summer Reading Challenge:

- Significantly improves reading confidence and independence
- Ensures pupils are ready for their return to school, preventing the summer reading 'dip'
- Aids the successful transition between year groups and key stages
- Contributes to *all* pupils' **achievement**
- Encourages extra-curricular activity encouraging family engagement with reading
- Develops links between your school, the library and the wider community

For children who took part in 2023:

- **80% read more** over the summer holidays
- 70% improved their reading skills
- 72% felt more confident about their reading

How it works:

- Children sign up through their local library and receive a collector's poster.
- They set a reading goal and borrow books of their choice during the summer, collecting special stickers and incentives.
- Library staff and volunteers help children to discover new books that suit their interests and reading level and run a programme of free themed activities in the library.
- Children who complete the Challenge are presented with a certificate.
- Tunstead Primary will **organise a special assembly to present the certificates** in the new term.
